I'm now in the process of writing up three issues, two of which I am trying to get out of the way so that we can get on a semblance of a schedule provided I can continue to publish as I have thus far. There are many other things that I try to do other than this hobby.

It is out of love for this wonderful family that I cannot give up so easily what has been started by those few that gathered here in Auburn in August of 1963 and organized the Kimbro-Kimbrough Genealogical Association. This small group has done much work for the Family and I'm sure that many of them will devote more time to it in the future but it is understandable why some would wish to put it aside for a time. The tradition of John KIMBROUGH the Colonist has been told many ways. I will now tell mine as it has been brought down from the Goldman KIMBROUGH Parent Head. We are connected with the Indian Tribe "Powhatan through John's grandsons - Marmaduke and Thomas. There were four brothers, one was killed in England. Marmaduke was killed in Maryland, Thomas died, we have no record of this, or of them in Virginia. I would appreciate any data you may have on Orman KIMBROUGH and Jane (ENLOW) KIMBROUGH. I am also running the Carter Family Line on my Mother's family. The ancestors are from the Carolinas, migrated direct from there in covered wagons. The blood lines are CARTER, PHILLIPS, MALONE and one line going into the CHAFFIN Family.

W. S. KIMBROUGH was born Dandridge, Jefferson County, Tennessee May 28, 1828 and is the son of Issac and Mary (RANDOLPH) KIMBROUGH. The father was born near New Market, Jefferson County, Tennessee April, 1788, and died in Polk County, Tennessee, Feb. 3, 1868. He was a very successful and noted Preacher of the Missionary Baptist Church, and rode as a missionary in East Tennessee and West North Carolina for several years. He was a great reader and a thorough theological student. He came to Polk County, Tennessee in 1849 and settled on the farm on which his son, our subject lives. He was a Democrat. His mother's ancestors came from England. She was born in Jefferson County, Tennessee, January 20, 1860 (sic, rbk). She was a member of the Missionary Baptist Church. Our subject was the 10th of 13 children. He secured a

liberal education in Jefferson County and has since been a close student.

THE HILDEBRAND HOUSE

About three miles south of Benton on the Old Federal Road stands the Hildebrand House, undisputedly the most distinctive architectural feat in Polk County, and stands high on the list of notable homes in the State of Tennessee. Remembering the Germanic origin of its building, Professor George Mellon of the University of Tennessee wrote that "there must have been intended some suggestion of Baronial life lived along the Rhine."

The house is located on the south bank of the Ocoee River, facing east. The architect was James KILLIAN, who is buried in the private cemetery behind the house. The front rooms of the structure are made of walnut planks two and half feet wide, the mantle of the great fireplace in the main room down stairs is decorated with a series of intricately carved "H" this motif being repeated around the eaves of the building. The kitchen is a marvelous place containing an eight foot wide fireplace and a hidden passageway to a place of safe concealment under the house. From the kitchen food moved to the dinning room on a dumb waiter. The massive stones of the foundation and the rafters pinned together by wooden pegs testify to the expertness of the work on this monumental building.

Peter HILDEBRAND some time around 1830 had work started on the house, which bears his name. Approximately seven years later after its completion he moved into it with his Indian wife and their children, but they remained there only a short time. "Those Damned Cherokees," as he described his sons were unaccustomed to glass windows

and such innovations of civilization, and created havoc in the beautiful building.

HILDEBRAND was custodian of the northern end of the overland portage system which

covered the eleven miles between the Ocoee and Conasauga Rivers.

This beautiful home was occupied for 21 years by the Porter KIMBROUGH family and

later for thirteen years by Mr. and Mrs. John GILBERT. The property is now owned by

Mrs. Nell Thomas WILLIAMS of Etowah, Tennessee.

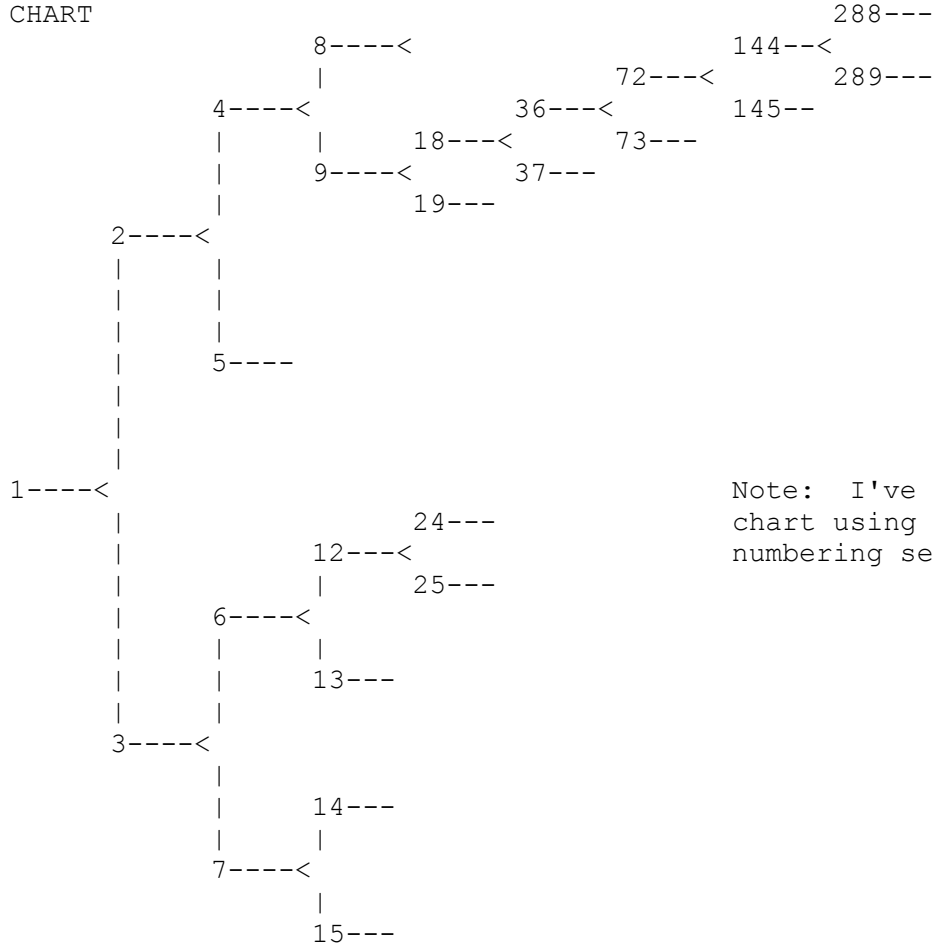

EXCURSUS - "THE KIMBROUGH FAMILY" FROM THE FILES OF THE LATE ROWELL A. BILLUPS

(1899-1960), GREENWOOD, MISSISSIPPI.

Marmaduke KIMBROUGH removed with other members of his family to Sumner County, Tenn.,

near Gallatin, in the Cumberland Valley north of Nashville.

The following appears in the War Records in the Tennessee State Library and Archives at Nashville and is quoted in Rowland's Mississippi, Heart of the South. "KIMBROUGH, Marmaduke, Private, enlisted Dec. 10, 1812, under Col. HALE and Capt. ALEXANDER, Vol. Inf."

Marmaduke KIMBROUGH enlisted under the command of the two officers and took part in the Horse Shoe Bend battle and was in the Battle of New Orleans in 1814 under Gen.

Andrew JACKSON. He returned to Sumner County where he died and is buried.

Orman L. KIMBROUGH removed from Tennessee to Carroll County in the early 1830's,

joining his brother, Marmaduke D. KIMBROUGH, who had preceded him. He was a merchant, planter, and attorney. In company with his brothers, Marmaduke and Thomas T.

KIMBROUGH, he conducted a large mercantile business in Carrollton.

He owned a large plantation at Jefferson, an island community in the northern part of

Carroll County, where he built an elegant home. This home was located on the old

state road, which ran from Nashville, through Grenada and Carrollton, to Natchez. It

was a large antebellum, two-story house where many guests were entertained. Jefferson

Davis, afterwards President of the Confederacy, on several occasions was a guest in

this home. Of interest also to visitors to the house was the fine deer park.

His name as an attorney first appears in the Carroll County Probate Court records of

March 1840. (Probate Court Minutes of Carroll County, Bk. "A" (1834-41), p. 175). He

was a law partner of James SHIRLEY in the 1840's in the law firm of SHIRLEY and

KIMBROUGH.

In politics he was a member of Whig partly. In the Southern Pioneer, he published in

Carrollton for Carroll, Choctaw and Tallahatchie Counties, under date of Dec. 5, 1840,

among a list of delegates appointed to the Whig State Convention appears the name of

O. L. KIMBROUGH, Esq.

Allen McCaskill KIMBROUGH was named for a close friend of his father's,

Allen MCCASKILL, a prominent planter who lived a few miles west of Carrollton.

His father, on the death of Allen MCCASKILL, was appointed administrator of his estate. He was educated at the University of

Virginia, receiving both his B.A. and LL.B. degrees from that institution. He

He served four years as County Superintendent of Education, and served as Chancellor of the Seventh Chancery District of the State from 1899 to 1903, having been appointed by Governor MCLAURRIN (a warm personal friend), governor LONGINO appointed him to his present position on the bench of the Fourth Judicial Circuit. In both branches of judicial service he has proved a most able and discriminating official and his service on the chancery bench in particular gained to him unreserved endorsement on the part of his profession and public in general. "He is a strong trial lawyer, is well grounded in the minutiae of the science of jurisprudence and has that mature judgment which makes him so well qualified for the office of which he is now in tenure. He is Vice-President of the First National Bank of Greenwood and has large agricultural interests, owning 3,000 acres of land, the greater portion of which lies within the confines of Leflore County".
