"This is the prettiest looking grand jury I ever saw," said Dist. Atty. Tom F. Young. And his statement won't be challenged.

Eleven of the 18 members of the Tallapoosa Grand Jury in session this week are women, undoubtedly the largest single number of women ever to serve on any jury in Alabama.

Well, how does a woman-dominated grand jury compare with the all-male grand juries which were usual until the U.S. Supreme Court said that all-male juries were unconstitutional?

"I've found them to be very efficient, they are conducting the affairs of the grand jury in a very business like manner," said Young, with conviction.

About the only difference he indicated was that there has to be less smoke in the grand jury room. Not as many of the women smoke.

Young said practically all of the women jurors are housewives, although some also have jobs such as secretaries and insurance executives.
