This is the first tax digest found in the court house, and was
taken to give a practically complete census of the heads of families of
that date, to identify their lands as headrights, and possible bounty
grants for Revolutionary service, and to replace in a measure the census

of 1812 in Washington, D. C. There is no complete digest until 1802,
